Dientes Offers Specialty Care

Until recently, Dientes had to refer out for procedures that required a specialist; most commonly, for root canals (endodontist) and complex extractions or other surgical procedures (oral surgeon). There was no endodontist in Santa Cruz County or surrounding counties who took Medi-Cal, and patients had to pay thousands of dollars to see a private endodontist. In the case of needing oral surgery, patients had to travel out of the county and endure a 3-4 month wait list for an appointment. Dientes is now providing both specialty care services at our Santa Cruz clinic twice a month. Dientes Dental Director Dr. Sepi Walthard explains, *"This kind of comprehensive care is not available anywhere else in our community for those who struggle in poverty. For this, I am especially proud!"*

Outreach Clinic Opens at Homeless Services Center

July 6th marked the first day of operations at our new 1-chair Outreach clinic located in HSC's renovated locker bay. "Transportation is a real challenge for our homeless patients and having a dental clinic on the same campus as other services. including healthcare, makes it easier to get dental care," comments Dientes Outreach Manager Tana Stragalinos. The clinic will be open one day a week to serve homeless day-users as well as families that are living in the Rebele Family Shelter!

Oral Health Access Santa Cruz County Launches

A school child has difficulty paying attention and avoids raising her hand. A veteran is unable to sleep and has missed a job interview. A senior citizen is losing weight and cannot maintain proper nutrition.

What do these people have in common? They suffer from untreated dental disease.

Limited dental care access might not seem like a crisis, but poor oral health has serious consequences. The resulting pain and complications of dental disease impact a person's ability to speak, chew, socialize, hold a job or attend school. "Even if you are not a dentist, you can help solve the dental care access and oral health challenges of Santa Cruz County."

In a study where welfare recipients with severe dental problems received care, those who completed their dental treatment were twice as likely to get jobs or move off of welfare as those who did not.

Additionally, evidence has shown a link between oral disease and diabetes, adverse birth outcomes, cardiovascular disease, Alzheimer's, stroke, and more. Proper dental care is crucial to preventative medicine.

Dientes commissioned an oral health needs assessment to get a picture of oral health in Santa Cruz County that offered some alarming results shown on page 3. In reality, the problem is even larger than these numbers suggest. They do not include the uninsured or those without public health benefits. Further, Medicare does not meet seniors' dental needs.

The tremendous lack of dental care access and education in Santa Cruz County must be addressed. Dientes Dental Director Dr. Sepi Walthard and County Supervisor Zach Friend are enthusiastic about chairing Oral Health Access Santa Cruz County. This steering committee of local health industry experts, community leaders, and education advocates, will work to define concrete ways to address one of the county's major hidden health epidemics.
