15 Years of Free Care for Kids!

One of our favorite days of the year, Dientes was proud to celebrate our 15th annual Give Kids A Smile Day! This free-care event for uninsured low-income children, brings together volunteers from the Monterey Bay Dental Hygienists' Association, community support, and Dientes staff. This year, we provided crucial dental care to 48 uninsured kids—the most ever!

Nadine brought her 5-year-old son, Miguel, to Dientes during Give Kids A Smile Day and he received two fillings. Nadine later told us, "Miguel was very nervous, but the staff here really helped him get over his nerves. We don't have insurance and going to the dentist is so expensive. If it wasn't for Dientes we wouldn't be able to get this care."

Children received free dental care valued at \$30,000. The services were provided in part by donations through Kaiser Permanente, 100 Women Who Care, and the 2018 Santa Cruz Gives campaign. Thank you to all who made this annual event possible!

Celebrating 3 Years of Care at the Homeless Services Center

In 2016 we opened our part-time dental clinic at the Homeless Services Center (HSC) with the vision of providing dental care integrated with medical care on a campus with other needed services. Three years, 700 patients, and 2,000 visits later, we celebrate this partnership!

Outreach Program Manager Nicole Mello states, "Being co-located with HSC and the Homeless Person's Health Project is the best way to remove transportation as a barrier to care. And by partnering, we are able to provide high-quality dental care that is connected to medical care, as well as other services, to help people out of homelessness."

You're Helping Patients Find **Dignity through Dentistry**

Gwynne has lived in Santa Cruz County for 50 years and was a licensed nurse. Years ago, a severe car accident left her with a disability. Now she lives on social security. Gwynne says that social security payments are not enough to cover her rent—let alone food, transportation, medical bills, and dental care.

"I never planned on going out like this—but none of us do. No one plans on being poor...but we all have surprises along the way."

Though life has had its difficulties for Gwynne, she says that her dental care has been one thing she

hasn't had to worry about as a Dientes patient. Before Dientes she struggled finding dental care.

"Other dentists wouldn't accept Medi-Cal. I was made to feel poor and ashamed," she commented. "With Dientes, I've never had to worry about my coverage, feeling ashamed, or feeling like I wasn't getting quality care."

Gwynne continued, "I wouldn't have any teeth or the ability to eat if it weren't for Dientes. That, and their kindness and respect, made a dramatic difference in my life and in my ability to keep my health. I'm so grateful."
